1.6. DEFINITION OF TERMS

1. *Id*

Id is the part of unconsciousness and the most primitive part of psyche which consists of stimulus and desire, needs, and instinctive impulse. It works based on principle of satisfaction and always be in contradiction with Superego.¹

2. Ego

Ego is the part of psyche which handles transactions with the outside area based on principle of reality. Ego acts as the mediator between Id and Superego.²

3. Superego

Superego is the part of ego which takes place in conscious condition and adapts with moral values from parents or society. Superego blocks the impulses of Id which cannot be accepted by parents or society which makes superego always be in contradiction with Id.³
