CHAPTER 5

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

5.1 Conclusion

The discussion in chapter 4 obviously shows that *SpongeBob SquarePants* episode Drive Thru is worth analyzing using Marxist Analysis. The analysis enables the writer to see the existence of the oppressions done by the bourgeoisie class who owns the capital toward the proletariat, the employee who sell their labors to the owner of the capital. Here in the discussion, Mr. Krabs as the owner of the Drive Thru oppresses Squidward and SpongeBob by exploiting them to do extra work to gain more profit, Mr. Krabs also denies his employees to get a good working condition. He deliberately refuses to listen to the employees' complaints. Mr. Krabs' greed is extended to the customer as well when instead of serving the customers well, he manages to get profitable gain from them.

The episode also shows the difference between two social classes in *SpongeBob SquarePants Drive Thru*, the bourgeoisie and the proletariat according to the ownership of property.
