

## CHAPTER 5

### CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

From the analyses in this study, it can be concluded that every beast has a different kind of traits and abilities that make Newt Scamander has a different way to learn their characteristics and to domesticate them. There are five classes to classify their traits and abilities. The more dangerous their traits and abilities make Newt harder to domesticate them. The beast's traits and abilities help the writer to find the charactonym based on their proper names. There are four out of eight charactonyms by Kalashnikov that are used in finding charactonym in this study. They are expressive-and-characteristic names, expressive names, anthroponyms with common stem, and intersemantizing names.

There are some beasts that include in expressive-and-characteristic names charactonym: Demiguise, Murtlap, Swooping Evil, Thunderbird, and Erumpent. They include in this charactonym based on their naming and traits, for example, Demiguise. The proper name of Demiguise contains a particular meaning that clearly describes Demiguise and is derived from the common stem: 'demi' means half and 'guise' means conceal something about nature, that already contains the idea of its ability to become invisible.

Besides expressive-and-characteristic names, there is also expressive names. The beasts are Occamy, Niffler, Mooncalf, and Billywig. The expressive names may not reflect the traits or ability of a character but cause association with an expressive subject, for example: Niffler, comes from 'pilfer' means 'to rob' that draws the meaning of the naming but mainly proper names containing in the stems

expressive words have this kind of significance, so that it is helped by the suffix -er to make Niffler's name becomes balance with its ability and trait.

The other charactonym is about anthroponyms with common stem for Bowtruckle. Anthroponyms with common stem is a charactonym about names which are part of background knowledge that in Bowtruckle's name is derived from words 'bow' and 'truckle' and those words are famous.

Lastly, the charactonym of intersemantizing names which includes Graphorn. This charactonym is supplemented by the characteristic significance for the naming. The meaning of the last word 'horn' is supplemented by the trait and ability of Graphorn.

Moreover, from the study above can be highlighted several conclusions that can also be the suggestion for the next study; (1) the characteristics of the character could help the writer find the common stem for finding the charactonym, (2) the charactonym could be seen from many aspects such as; the proper name, the informational function, and the way of the writer's perspective, (3) charactonym usually use for a fictional character that makes the writer has a brave imagination when analyzing it, and (4) learn deeply about the charactonym's study from different sources.
