

CHAPTER 3

METHOD OF DATA COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS

3.1. Type of Research

In this study, the writer used a formalist approach to analyze the characters and their characterizations in Mark Twain's *The Prince and the Pauper*. Formalist approach is an approach that emphasizes the way of reading literature which was given a special dimension and emphasis by British and American critics in the first two-thirds of the twentieth century (Davis, Guerin, Labor, Morgan, & Willingham, 1979, p. 96).

3.2. Method of Data Collection

The main purpose of this paper is to analyze the characters and their characterizations from a novel which is written by an American author, Mark Twain.
