CHAPTER 5

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

This thesis elaborated the turn-taking organized and the social action in an interruption in Ngobam using the CA method and transcribed Jefferson's Transcription System Symbols.

5.1 Conclusion

Concerning the first objective of the study, which is to know how the turn is organized in *Ngobam*, it is revealed that the most frequent type of turn is questionanswer. It appears 127 times. Question-answers always ensure that the two participants understand each other's topics. Therefore, there are no misunderstandings between the two participants. The social action that achieved in question-answer part is to explain and to get more information about AL's life both as a musician and businessman, and also how AL stopped using drugs. Therefore, the turn-taking was going well.

Regarding the study's second objective, which is to reveals the social action achieved in interruption, eight social actions have been achieved in *Ngobam*. (1) To change the topic by asking about the truth of Wong Aksan who got fired because he played too jazz. (2) To know what was going on in the Dewa Band back then. (3) To give a respond to what AL said. (4) To confirm what AL said. (5) To change the topic for continuing his explanation about his drugs life. (6) To force GH to listen to what AL said. (7) To correct GH's information about DEWA. (8) To let GH drinks in the middle of the conversation.

It can be concluded that question-answer becomes the most frequent turn because. Question-answers could help both understand each other's topic of conversation. The social actions that have been achieved in interruption can help the listeners get to know AL's private life, both in music and in business and how AL stops drugs, and how the band Dewa established so that the audience can take good information with them from their conversation.

5.2 Suggestions

This study has several limitations, which makes this research far from perfect. The current researcher has made suggestions that can be measured for the next researcher. It would be more interesting if the next researcher analyzed the turn organization of adjacency pairs, gaps, overlaps, interruptions, and pauses of casual conversational in other podcasts. Also, the researcher suggests that the next researcher would analyze the social action in adjacency pairs, gaps, overlaps, and pauses.
