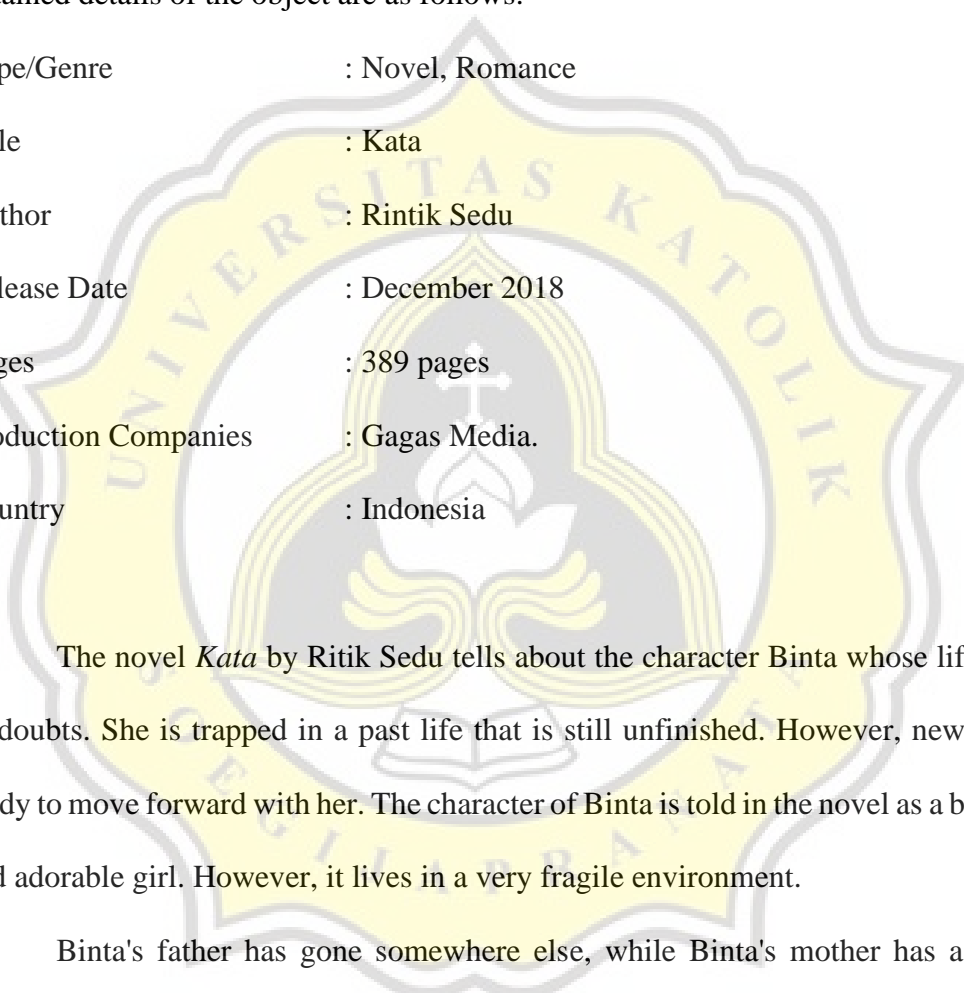
3.1 Research Design

There are two types of research design, namely qualitative research and quantitative research. The researcher uses qualitative research to analyze the data in this research. Rather than simply designating and enumerating categories of experience, qualitative writers provide detailed descriptions of the social organization and interpersonal processes in question. Qualitative research produces data in the form of texts – for example, transcribed interviews or ethnographic fieldwork notes – and concentrates, in the majority of its (hermeneutic) interpretative procedures, on the textual medium as a basis for its work (Creswell, 2007). This study is classified as a qualitative analysis because it analyzes *Kata's* figurative language, which involves the interpretation of data. In this section, the researcher discusses data collection and analysis.

3.2 Method of Data Collection

3.2.1 Source

The data used in this research is a novel entitled *Kata* (Rintik Sedu, 2018). The obtained details of the object are as follows:

In analyzing simile, metaphor, irony, hyperbole, and personification, the researcher first identified the occurrence of expressions that contain figurative language in the novel. The data of this research were categorized into sentences according to their types of figurative language. Abrams and Harpham (2012) state that there are five types of figurative language: personification, simile, metaphor, hyperbole, and irony. The researcher categorized the dialogues in the novel into the above categories. From the figurative language identified above, the researcher figured out the most dominant and powerful one. After figuring out the most dominant one, the researcher analyzed it in terms of what effect it brings to the emotion and tone of the story.
