CHAPTER 5

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

5.1 Conclusion

In Rampage (Peyton, 2018), from the self-conflicts that Davis experiences, he becomes a more caring individual as shown in the film. From the beginning of the film, viewers can see how Davis despises humans. The writer analyzes the causes of self-conflict in the protagonist. His distrust of humans and hatred of human hypocrisy make him undervalue other people. The self-conflict that Davis experiences seems to involve a dilemma between saving his animal friend, George, and saving other human beings threatened by the presence of George. However, as he struggles to overcome his self-conflict, he begins to develop sympathy for others. There are some evidence that shows Davis' humanity such as the scene where Davis is worried that George could kill the people on the plane, the troops sent by Colonel Blake, his request to stop launching the MOABs, and when he looks at citizens with a grateful face. Rampage (Peyton, 2018) also articulates moral values demonstrated by the protagonist. Davis shows his sympathy throughout the film. He chooses to protect both human lives and George's lives. The writer concludes that the protagonist in the film Rampage is proven to still have humanity where he previously experienced internal conflict with himself. Davis's inability to make a choice between saving humans or letting George destroy everything, results in a quite interesting ending that can be categorized as a good ending.
