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DIGITAL LITERACY TO ENHANCE BILINGUAL PROGRAM TEACHERS' COMMUNICATIVE COMPETENCE

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






 This study highlighted the bilingual program teachers' communicative competence in English and their ability in using technology to enhance their communicative competence.





Research Questions

- What kind of technology tools that the bilingual program teachers use in their classrooms?
- 2. What kind of e-sources that are used by the bilingual program teachers?
- How do the bilingual teachers perceive digital literacy as a tool to enhance their communicative competence?

Research Methodology

- Setting : 5 private primary schools which have bilingual programs
- Subjects : 56 teachers
- Instruments : CCA, observation, interview, FGD



Teachers' perceptions on the use of technology

Digital literacy helps teachers explore and get more sources for their teaching.

Teachers learn and improve their CC through interactive online teaching materials

Being computer and internet literate helps teachers teach better in English.

Teachers can access and use internet to support their teaching

Digital tools and systems make teachers more nervous when teaching in English.

Teachers' perceptions on the use of technology

Knowledge about some technology tools should be accompanied with the ability to apply the applications and systems related to the tools. Teachers only use the tools but do not really know how the tools work and how to use some applications/soft ware

Conclusion

- 35 out of 56 subjects (62.5 %) ranged from moderate to competent level of communicative competence and the rest (37.5%) are categorized as limited communicators.
- The moderate and competent teachers are commonly digitally literate.
- Digital literacy enhances teachers' communicative competence



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
