BACKGORUND



- Indonesian society is a communalistic society;
- It has so many traditions including the tradition of 'mudik' during religious holidays to celebrate those holidays with the loves one in their hometown or village;
- Since the pandemic, this tradition has been banned and temporarily suspended by the government for the sake of preventing and breaking the chain of the spread of the corona virus (covid-19).

BACKGROUND



- In addition to religious traditions, since the last few years, new traditions of gathering or crowding to support political or religious figures have also emerged.
- One of the most phenomenal cases was the case of the 'crowd' of Petamburan and/or Megamendung which finally brought one of the religious/community leaders to court.



PROBLEM

Given that there are so many violations of national regulations regarding health quarantine and infectious disease outbreaks as well as local regulations regarding for large-scale social restrictions, this paper tries to see the relationship between religious traditions (eid, christmas, etc.) with the increasing number of people infected by the Corona Virus and relate it also to society's legal awareness for this social restriction.




METHODOLOGY

- The analysis was carried out qualitatively;


SOCIAL RESTRICTION REGULATION





- Regulation is National, Provincial: 34, City district and Regency 514 (416 Regency & 98 City);
- Each Province, city and regency has its own restriction policies;
- There are also sectoral policies i. from the ministry, department, institution etc.
- Do IndonesiaN people aware of the dangerous situation and the social restriction regulation? Do they have enough literacy for Social Restriction Regulation?





LAWYERS BEAR IN MIND

- Meeting ID to be shared with advocates 15 minutes before hearing commences
- Advocates should mute their microphones until they are allowed to speak
- Advocates must ntain dress code le appearing

Advocates should ensure proper lighting and set up their device at a quiet place

THEORETICAL FRAMEWORK: WHY PEOPLE OBEY THE LAW?





Do people obey the law because they fear that they will be punished?

Or because they think that the government, courts or police are usually fair? Do most people care about whether they win or lose?

Or about having the legal system that threat them with dignity?

THEORETICAL FRAMEWORK: TOM. R TYLER (1990)



- If people view compliance with the law as appropriate because of their attitudes about how they should behave, they will voluntarily assume the obligation to follow legal rules. They will feel personally committed to obeying the law, irrespective of whether they risk punishment for breaking the law;
- NORMATIVE COMMITMENT: Involve Personal Morality or Legitimacy;
 - Normative commitment through personal morality means obeying a law because one feels the law is just;
 - Normative commitment through legitimacy means obeying a law because one feels that the authority enforcing the law has the right to dictate behavior

AFFECTING FACTORS?











- Economic Condition, social class
- Duration of the quarantine;
- Educcation, Literacy etc.
- Perceptions of the benefits and risks of complying with the law and the regulation;
- Perception of health care and service;
- Family situation etc.



NEW NORMAL: CHALLENGE



- Could the situation return to normal, considering that the tradition of religious celebrations is difficult to stop?
- Society still need socialization, literacy, supervision, law enforcement.
